Year 4 Curriculum Information – Summer Term 2018



The information detailed below provides an overview of the topics and objectives which will be taught in Year 4 during the summer term. The learning for pupils across the year band will be differentiated to meet their needs, and the planned activities and learning may change based on arising opportunities.

Subject	Learning and activities
English	<p>We are looking at 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and are going to be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Writing a newspaper report ● Writing a diary entry for the Iron Man <p>We are also going to be looking at Saving the Whales focusing on writing persuasive letters to SeaWorld.</p>
Maths	<p>We are looking at all aspects of the Year 4 curriculum and recapping areas including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Fractions ● Measure and converting measurements ● Money ● Co-ordinates and data
Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Our topic is Living things and their habitats ● Looking at different habitats ● How animals adapt to their habitat and surroundings ● Food chains and survival
Topic	<p>Our topic is 'It's A Small World'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Look at immigration ● Looking at what it means to be British ● Looking at our local geography and comparing it to another area ● Thinking about the traditions and cultures that have positively impacted on ours.
PE	<p>PE lessons will take place on a Wednesday morning and children will need correct PE kit and trainers. The children will move on to Athletics during the summer term in preparation for House Games and Sports Day.</p>
RE	<p>We are looking at Jewish and Christian beliefs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● People of a Jewish faith being committed to God ● Christianity prayer and worship
Music	<p>Within Music, the children are continuing with learning to play an instrument (the recorder) and are also continuing to read music and learn the correct terminology associated with this.</p>
PSHE	<p>We are looking at relationships</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Love and loss ● Memories and special pets

Ways you can help your child at home:

- Bring in items linked to the topic where possible
- Encourage your child to read every day and discuss what they have read- Bug Club online
- Practise multiplication facts for all of the times tables
- Help them to practise their spellings each day and the 100 spellings that are on the class Dojo page
- Where possible, give them the opportunity to write about different things in order to encourage them to practice different writing skills.
- Encourage them to do their homework in a planned way.
- Encourage a joined handwriting style (in line with the school's policy)
